MFIS National School Survey

Thank you to our school community for participating in the MFIS 2023 National School Survey conducted by the National School Surveys organization in Term 2, 2023. Your feedback and insights are invaluable in shaping the continuous enhancement of the education we provide.

We received a commendable 25% response rate from parents. The survey outcomes revealed an overall satisfaction score of 69%, which remains consistent with the 2021 figures and notably increased from the 62% recorded in 2015. The results also highlighted an increased approval rating in the perception of the school being well-managed, with a mean score of 67%, an improvement from previous years.

The survey results indicated strong support for instilling Islamic values, promoting personal growth, and ensuring adequate access to technology.

Areas for improvement primarily focused on behaviour management, enhanced parent-teacher communication, teacher consistency, school cleanliness, student leadership programs, and a desire for a wider range of extracurricular activities.

Based on your feedback, an action plan has been developed to address the areas recommended for improvement. This will be added to the current list of strategic projects.

We are committed to continuously improving the learning opportunities and experiences for the benefit of our students.

Message from School Chaplain

This message emphasizes the importance of unity and empathy within the community, drawing on the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (SAW) that serve as a compass that directs us towards righteousness and communal harmony. CURRICULUM UPDATE

We are delighted to announce the successful completion of the 2023 Higher School Certificate (HSC) examinations by our 168 Year 12 students. This dedicated group has persevered through 20 examinations, demonstrating resilience, commitment, and academic excellence as each one of them worked towards their personal best. As they await the release of their ATARs on 14 December 2023, we share in their anticipation and excitement for the next chapter in their educational journey.



In the spirit of unity and celebration, we are eager to reconnect with our 2023 alumni. We have scheduled campus-based morning teas

The Yearly Exam period has started for other cohorts. Beyond mastering content, navigating examinations is a holistic journey requiring a balance of effective organisational skills and overall wellbeing. As discussed during the online Parent Partnership Webinar last week, a balanced and well-supported approach can lead to not only academic success but also the development of resilient and confident individuals. The dedicated team of Grade/Stage Coordinators, Year Advisors, Wellbeing leaders, Counsellors, and class/subject teachers can support students through this period.

Year 11 students have recently received their Yearly Reports, marking the completion of the 12 Preliminary Units. They have seamlessly transitioned into their HSC courses this term, with many confirming their pattern of study by embarking on 10 HSC units. This foundational step sets the stage for a focused and purposeful HSC year ahead.

Year 10 students have successfully selected their 12 Preliminary units, confirming their pattern of study starting in 2024. Year 8 students have chosen two electives from a diverse range, allowing them to delve into areas of interest and passion. As part of our commitment to their success, all students have been advised of the courses they have been placed into for the upcoming academic year. If there are any uncertainties or if your child would like further clarification on their course selections, we encourage them to reach out to their respective teachers.

We have embraced educational transformation this year with a curriculum reform, beginning with the introduction of the new K-2 English and Mathematics syllabi. As we stand at the threshold of a transformative journey, we are preparing for the implementation of the remaining Years 3-10 English, Mathematics, and Arabic syllabi in the coming year. Our dedicated educators have been actively engaged in professional development to foster familiarity but also to design well-informed programs aligning seamlessly with the mandated syllabus outcomes.

The 2024 textbook lists have been released on Five Senses Education. We recommend placing your orders early to ensure that students begin the year with the necessary resources. Students in Year 7-9 now have the option to purchase certain textbooks in both eBook and print formats, due to the availability of school-provided laptops.

We are excited to share that the campus-based transition programs are underway for our Year 6 students who will be embarking on their high school journey next year. These programs encompass a variety of engaging activities such as wellbeing workshops, scientific experiments, discussions on the ethical use of technology and team building exercises.

Participants in the Academy U Program have successfully concluded the induction program focussed on the Leadership in Complexity unit offered by the University of Western Sydney. This initiative aims to enhance familiarity with a university setting, cultivate academic writing skills, and create avenues for networking with peers. Additionally, participants have the chance to explore scholarship opportunities as part of the program.
