CURRICULUM UPDATE

Welcome to the 2025 Academic Year!

We were delighted to welcome 238 of our youngest learners in kindergarten as they embark on their educational journey on 5 February. At the other end of this journey, we have our largest-ever HSC cohort, growing from 180 students in 2024 to 222 this year. We are committed to supporting all our learners and encouraging each one to strive for their personal best. This year, our staff




professional learning will focus on the Instructional Practice domain of the Teaching and Learning Framework. This domain emphasizes providing clarity on the deeper purpose of educational content, followed by strategies such as explicit teaching, progressing towards collaborative and ultimately independent learning.

Celebrating the Success of Our 2024 HSC Cohort

Congratulations to our 2024 HSC cohort, who undertook 20 conventional courses and 2 acceleration courses, completing the same programs and assessments across three campuses. Their outstanding results reflect their dedication and perseverance, with 55 Band 6 and 211 Band 5 results. Notably, two students earned a place on the HSC All-round Achievers List, having achieved the highest band across all 10 units, and the top ATAR reached an impressive 99.4.

Academy U—Leadership in Complexity cohort

The Academy U program offered through the University of Western Sydney equips students for a smooth transition university to introducing them to new study and career paths they might not have previously considered. This year, for the first time, selected MFIS students in Years 9-12 will engage in this enriching academic and personal experience. National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

NAPLAN will take place from Wednesday, 12 March to Monday, 24 March. Students in Year 3 and Year 5 will need to bring their own headsets, which were included in their book packs ordered through Five Senses. Year 7 and Year 9 students must also bring their own headsets and ensure their devices are fully charged. Students have had opportunities to practice on the online platform to prepare for the tests.

Please note that wireless headphones or earbuds (e.g., AirPods) are not suitable for the test. As an adaptive online assessment, NAPLAN tailors questions based on student responses, providing a personalised test experience that offers a more accurate measure of achievement and deeper diagnostic insights. If you have any questions regarding the test schedule, please contact the Head of Campus.

Year 12 Parent-Teacher Afternoons

Year 12 parents attended Parent-Teacher afternoons in Week 4, providing timely opportunities to discuss their child's progress and learning needs. Parents are encouraged to maintain open communication with subject teachers to ensure students receive the necessary support and resources to succeed.

The Year 12 Half-Yearly Examination schedule begins on Friday, 28 March. To support revision, students are encouraged to consolidate their content knowledge by working through past exam papers provided by teachers. Additionally, the campus library offers a selection of hardcopy past papers and ATAR Notes, available for students to access during study periods.

Enhancing Our Reading Culture

Reading is a key indicator of academic success, and we are committed to fostering a strong reading culture across all campuses. Our libraries remain open during recess and lunch, providing students with opportunities to borrow books and explore a diverse selection of reading materials. In addition to library borrowing, primary classrooms are stocked with a rotating collection of 30 books, refreshed monthly, ensuring students have daily access to engaging literature. In secondary, Year 7-10 students have a dedicated literacy and numeracy period every fortnight, reinforcing essential skills to support their learning.

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Feed-the-fasting fundraiser —Extended until Friday 14 March 2025

Our Feed-the-Fasting fundraiser is an opportunity for our school community to come together in the spirit of generosity and compassion. Running from Monday, 3 March to Friday, 14 March 2025, this initiative encourages students, with the support of their families and friends, to contribute towards providing Iftaar (dinner) and Suhoor (breakfast) for families in need overseas. Progressive Achievement Test (PAT) Update

The PAT testing window took place in Week 4, providing students with experience in an online testing environment similar to NAPLAN. These adaptive tests in Maths and Reading not only help students develop confidence in digital assessments but also prepare them for the increasing shift towards online exams. With the HSC Enterprise Computing and Software Engineering exams moving online this year, it is expected that more HSC subjects will follow this transition. PAT results, along with other internal and external assessment data, will play a key role in the selection process for Stage 5 Acceleration courses and some Stage 6 courses. This data helps the school determine learning starting points and refine targeted teaching strategies. A second round of PAT assessments will take place in Term 4, serving as an additional measure to monitor students' academic progress.

BLESSED MONTH OF RAMADAN

Assalamu Alaikum Wa Rahmatullahi Wa Barakatuh,

As we welcome the blessed month of Ramadan, it is a wonderful opportunity for us to reflect on its significance and the values it instills in our hearts and communities. Ramadan is not just a time of fasting but a period of spiritual growth, kindness, and unity. One of the greatest virtues of Ramadan is its association with the revelation of the Quran. Muslims believe that during this month,



the Quran was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) as guidance for all of humanity. Allah states in the Quran:

"The month of Ramadan is that in which was sent down the Quran, as a guide to mankind, with clear signs for guidance and the criterion (between right and wrong)." (2:185)

Fasting during Ramadan is one of the Five Pillars of Islam and is an obligatory act of worship for all eligible Muslims. From dawn until sunset, they abstain from food, drink, and other physical needs, cultivating self-discipline, patience, and empathy for those less fortunate. Beyond its physical aspects, fasting serves as a means to cleanse the soul and refocus on faith. A unique aspect of Ramadan is the belief that during this month, the gates of Paradise are opened, the gates of Hell are closed, and the devils are chained. The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said:

"When Ramadan begins, the gates of Paradise are opened and the gates of Hell are closed, and the devils are put in chains." (Sahih Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

Among the last ten nights of Ramadan is Laylat al-Qadr, known as the Night of Decree. This night is described in the Quran as being "better than a thousand months" (97:3). Muslims dedicate these nights to increased worship, seeking Allah's mercy and blessings. Ramadan is also a time of generosity and giving. Acts of charity (sadaqah) and the obligation of Zakat al-Fitr remind Muslims of their duty to support those in need. The communal spirit is further strengthened through shared iftar meals, nightly prayers (Taraweeh), and fostering bonds of kindness and compassion.

As we observe Ramadan, let us embrace its spirit by showing kindness, patience, and understanding towards one another. Whether fasting or not, we can all participate in acts of generosity, reflection, and gratitude. Let us use this month to strengthen our bonds as a community and support each other in acts of goodness.

Wishing you all a blessed and peaceful Ramadan.
