MFIS Umrah Tour 2025 – A Journey of Faith and Discovery

Alhamdulillah, some of our Year 11 students and staff successfully completed the 2025 MFIS Umrah Tour over the break. From the serene moments at Masjid Al-Nabawi to the sacred rites of Umrah in Makkah, it was a journey of spiritual growth and deep reflection. In Al-Madinah al-Munawwarah, our learners experienced profound spiritual moments, beginning with Tahajjud and Fajr prayers at Masjid Al-Nabawi, followed by attending a Janazah prayer. They visited significant sites such as Mount Uhud, Masjid al-Qiblatain, and Uthman's Date Farm, and explored Islamic heritage through a guided tour of the Masjid Al-Nabawi Museum. The journey started in Jordan, where students reflected at Masjid Ahl Al-Kahf—the Cave of the Seven Sleepers, a site mentioned in the Qur'an—and explored the ancient city of Jarash and the historical Castle of Salahuddin, deepening their understanding of Islamic history and legacy. 

Service in Action: Living Our Values

At MFIS, service is woven into the fabric of our educational philosophy. This term, our learners and community actively engaged in meaningful initiatives rooted in empathy and collective impact. This term, our school community demonstrated the true spirit of service through several impactful initiatives. At the Mothers & Daughters Fundraiser Dinner, held in partnership with Chris O'Brien Lifehouse, we raised an incredible \$16,000 in support of breast cancer research and support services.



Our Year 12 students led a meaningful Ramadan campaign, raising \$20,000 with Human Appeal Australia to fund the construction of a mosque for an underprivileged community. Additionally, the Principal's Feed the Fasting Campaign, in collaboration with Zakat House, brought together our entire school to raise \$21,000, providing vital Iftar and Suhoor meals to families in Lebanon. These acts of service reflect the beauty of Islam in action and instill lasting values of compassion, responsibility, and leadership in our learners.

NAPLAN 2025 Results

The NAPLAN 2025 results are anticipated to be released to schools in mid-June. Individual student reports will be distributed to parents at the beginning of Term 3. National summary data is expected to be published in late July or early August 2025, providing a comprehensive overview of student performance across Australia.

CURRICULUM UPDATE

The Niyyah Project remains a cornerstone of our commitment to embedding Islamic principles within a distinct and purposeful educational philosophy. This term, the MFIS Teaching and Learning Framework continues to guide our Professional Learning Programs, with a particular focus on fostering growth through learning from mistakes, creating space for thoughtful reflection, and tailoring content to sustain and challenge student learning.



Half-Yearly Reports for Year 12 students, and Year 11 students participating in the Acceleration Program, will be published in Week 3, available via the Parent Portal. These reports offer a detailed summary of assessment performance, reflecting work completed throughout Term 4, 2024, and Term 1, 2025. We encourage parents to reach out to subject teachers with any questions or concerns. Recently held Parent-Teacher Interviews across our campuses provided valuable opportunities for meaningful dialogue on how we can continue to support and enhance each student's learning journey together.

To further support our Year 12 students, we have partnered with educational consultant Graham Wright to provide individualised HSC Trajectory Reports. These reports, based on preliminary exam data, offer students a clear picture of their current academic standing and progress toward their ATAR goals. Each student participated in a one-on-one meeting with a senior staff member to reflect on their performance and identify strategies for improvement. A second Trajectory Report, incorporating Half-Yearly exam results, will be issued later this term to track growth and guide next steps toward achieving personal bests.

Year 12 students from all campuses recently participated in the Personal Best presentation, an initiative aimed at fostering academic excellence and purposeful learning. The session provided students with evidence-based strategies for exam preparation, stress and time management, and a deeper understanding of ATAR calculations and university progression trends. Beyond practical tools, the presentation encouraged students to connect with the broader purpose of their education, empowering them to take ownership of their goals and strive confidently toward their personal best.

On Monday 26 May, Year 11 students from Beaumont Hills and Hoxton Park will join their peers at the Greenacre Secondary campus for the annual MFIS Careers Day. This important event offers students direct access to university representatives and the chance to speak with professionals from a range of industries, including some of our own inspiring alumni. Special thanks to our Careers Advisors, Ms O'Connor (Hoxton Park and Beaumont Hills) and Ms Mehana (Greenacre), for coordinating this unique cross-campus initiative. Our Year 7-10 students have embraced the use of technology with their 1:1 device, eliminating the need for physical textbooks and promoting digital literacy, an increasingly valued competency in our contemporary world. To support safe and purposeful technology use in the classroom, the school has implemented Linewize and Classwize, enabling educators to effectively monitor and manage student device activity. Additionally, parents have access to Qustodio, a device management platform to develop healthy digital habits, including setting screen time limits. Parents are encouraged to reach out to our IT team for further information.

In acknowledgment of our strategic commitment to educational innovation and digital excellence, we have been recognised as a Microsoft Surface Lighthouse School. This distinction grants the school priority access to Microsoft's cutting-edge educational technologies, advanced security infrastructure, and targeted professional learning opportunities. Building on this recognition, we are actively exploring the integration of additional Microsoft tools such as Reading Progress, Reflect, and Immersive Reader, to further enhance student literacy, promote engagement, and support overall wellbeing.

Congratulations to Ms Thamina Kassar, Wellbeing Coordinator at Greenacre Secondary, for the recent publication of her action research project exploring the application of Islamic Pedagogy to student wellbeing. This significant contribution marks a cultural and strategic shift, positioning Malek Fahd Islamic School at the forefront of developing an indigenous Islamic model of wellbeing in education. Ms Kassar's paper offers a critically reflective and authentic approach to policy implementation, student support, and middle leadership, anchored in Islamic values and a strong sense of moral purpose. Her work not only enriches our school community but also contributes meaningfully to the broader educational discourse.



We are proud to share that Ms Doha Adra was invited to attend the prestigious HALT (Highly Accomplished and Lead Teacher) Summit held in Canberra this year. This annual summit brings together leading educators from across the nation, offering HALTs the opportunity to engage with prominent thought leaders, strengthen their leadership capabilities, and foster meaningful collaboration with fellow accomplished professionals. During the summit, Ms Adra proudly shared Malek Fahd Islamic School's vision and mission with Mr Tim Bullard, CEO of the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL). HADITH OF JIBREEL

Assalamu Alaikum Wa Rahmatullahi Wa Barakatuh,

As we continue our journey together—nurturing both academic excellence and spiritual growth—I'd like to share a meaningful reminder about the purpose of Islamic education and the character it is meant to shape.



One of the most powerful teachings comes from the Hadith of Jibreel, as narrated by Umar ibn Al-Khattab (RA). A man once came to the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him), dressed in pure white with no signs of travel, and sat knee-to-knee with the Prophet, asking him about Islam, Iman, Ihsan, and the signs of the Last Day. After the man left, the Prophet (SAW) told his companions: "That was Jibreel. He came to teach you your religion." (Sahih Muslim)

This hadith not only summarises the foundations of our faith but also highlights the etiquette of seeking knowledge—with sincerity, respect, humility, and purpose. Jibreel's calm presence, polite manner, and thoughtful questions provide a model of behaviour that reflects the essence of Islamic character.

As high school students, you are building the foundation of your adult lives. Islamic education is not just about knowing your religious duties—it's about how you live them: with good manners, sound choices, sincere intentions, and respectful interactions. Strive to be like Jibreel in your pursuit of knowledge: humble, respectful, curious, and purposeful.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said: "Indeed, I was sent to perfect good character." (Sahih Bukhari)

This reminds us that the Prophet's mission was not only to bring divine guidance, but also to refine and uplift our conduct.

May Allah (SWT) guide you all in your learning, character, and faith.
